## General observations and discussion:

- Action Plan: useful tool to achieve FCS
- First time 3 regions work together to address habitats' conservation
- Pilot experience that will be useful for future action plans
- Importance of taking into account variability across the region (subtypes)
- Harmonisation needed on methodologies and procedures for assessment and monitoring the habitat status: area, structure & function, pressures and threats
