Ensuring continuity of measures

- look for holistic approaches when addressing conservation issue
- focus on community engagement!
- highlight economic benefits
- ensure balanced partnerships (public, private, NGOs)
- adapt the regulatory context to project findings (e.g. village lightning)
- reduce dependency on <u>project</u> funding & ensure staff continuity
- actively search for private funding sources (e.g. company funding)
- actively search for political-level ownership



Best practices to be replicated

- remove threats (e.g. Invasive Alien Species)
- have a communication strategy
- create multidisciplinary teams (e.g. psychologists and anthropologists to facilitate community engagement, involve economists as experts on funding)
- report on failures!
- create and maintain data sharing repositories
