New action framework

Revised Pollinators Initiative

42 actions across 3 pillars:

- I. Improving knowledge**
- II. Tackling causes of pollinator decline**
- III. Mobilising society and strategic planning**



I) Improving Knowledge

- Comprehensive monitoring system & indicators
- Basic and applied research
- Red List assessment of key pollinator groups
- Mapping Key Pollinator Areas
- Capacity building: experts, field tools, data infrastructure and access



II) Tackling pollinator decline

- Conservation: Species Action Plans, Habitats Directive, LIFE, “Buzz Lines”
- Agriculture – pollinator friendly farming
- Pesticides – risk assessment and management
- Urban areas: guides, urban greening plans
- Invasive Alien Species management, promotion of native plants
- Climate change: vulnerable zones, adaptation
- Light pollution



III) Mobilising society & strategic planning

- Citizens (youth)
- **Businesses**
- National pollinator strategies
- Regional and local plans
- Stakeholder collaboration
- Global action
