THE LIFE BIODIV'FRANCE PROJECT



Expectations from the European Commission

<u>Objective</u>: Catalyse the implementation of national strategies or action plans <u>Expectations</u>:

- Significant contribution to the favorable conservation status of habitats and species of Community interest

- Significant contribution to reducing pressures on habitats and species and restoring degraded ecosystems

The OFB, mandated by the MTECT to submit the French application in March 2023

- Reference strategy: National Biodiversity Strategy (NBS)
- LIFE's role: to provide the engineering required to implement a series of NBS measures
 - identify and monitor "complementary funds" that will also contribute to the implementation of the SNB
- Report to the EU on the implementation of the SNB through direct actions and complementary funds.

Financial framework

- **50 M€ over 9 years**, including 30M€ EU grant
- LIFE **aid rate**: 60% maximum
- Complementary funds: 247 M€, made up of EU funds (ERDF and regional EAFRD).



AMBITION AND OBJECTIVES



Project ambition: To regain biodiversity in France by acting on pressures using both direct and indirect levers, directly in line with the spirit of the NBS.

General objective: Halt the decline in biodiversity and improve the conservation status of habitats and species in mainland France and the French overseas territories.

6 specific objectives :

- 1. Ensure that biodiversity issues are systematically taken into account in local projects through support for Local Authorities
- 2. Improve the conservation status of habitats and species of Community interest in protected areas, including Natura 2000 sites
- 3. Bring about changes in practices that integrate biodiversity in the main sectors that have an impact on biodiversity
- 4. Raising public awareness of biodiversity protection issues
- 5. Facilitating access to biodiversity-related professions and promoting skills development for all stakeholders
- 6. Encourage more projects by leveraging European, national and regional structural funds to finance biodiversity.


PROJECT MANAGEMENT


MOBILISING




