
Creation of prerequisites for the return of the Mediterranean monk seal to the area of the eastern Adriatic


Eastern Adriatic Monk Seal Project



The Mediterranean monk seal (Monachus monachus) is the most iconic species of the Mediterranean Sea. Yet also, it is one of the most endangered marine mammals on earth. Species pupping and resting habitats (i.e. marine caves) are threatened by human activities such as tourism development and habitat deterioration, resulting destruction urbanization, in and fragmentation. Deliberate killing by fishermen and drowning due to accidental entanglement in fishing gear are additional problems. Through the joined efforts od MOm from Greece, PPNA from Albania, CZIP from Monte Negro, **Biom** from Croatia and coordinated by **EuroNatur**, the Eastern Adriatic monk seal project has been developed to meet the challenges of creating circumstances that enable the safe and sustainable return of the species to the Eastern Adriatic.

Project activities:

Habitat mapping:

• Field surveys, data analysis, and reporting

Information sharing network building and expansion:

Promotion of existing reporting tools for sighting monk seals and implementation of new ones

Estimation of the current conditions for the reestablishment of the species population in the Adriatic Sea:

- Roadmap document containing draft guidelines for species and habitat protection
- Paper on analysis of the Croatian fishing sector

Awareness-raising activities:

- Education for the general public
- Meetings and workshops with stakeholders on the decision-making level and representatives of the fishing sector

- Cleaning marine habitats actions
