


Accommodation

Transport

Prague has a very reliable and dense network of public transportation. The delegates are expected to arrange and cover transportation from or to the airport or train/bus station to the seminar venue themselves.

• Public transport from the Central Station (The main train station – Praha Hlavní Nádraží)

The easiest way is to take the tram 26 (from Bolzanova street) towards Divoká Šárka and get off at Dejvická. From there, take the bus 107 to bus stop Zemědělská univerzita. The journey takes about 38 minutes.

• Public transport from the bus station (Florenc Praha)

Take the metro line B (yellow) in the direction Zličín. Change in station Můstek and take the metro line A (green) in the direction of Nemocnice Motol. Get off at Dejvická. From there, take the bus 107 to bus stop Zemědělská univerzita. The journey takes about 30-35 minutes.

• Public transport from the airport

Take the trolleybus 59 (the bus stop is located directly in front of Terminal 2) to Nádraží Veleslavín. Change here and take the metro line A (green line) in the direction of Depo Hostivař. Get off at Dejvická. The journey takes about 45 minutes. You can buy tickets at Prague Airport from the tourist information (T2 Arrival lobby 2A) or at the yellow vending machines at the bus stop.

Tickets for public transport

Tickets for public transport are valid for all means of transport – buses, trams and metro (except the Petřín Funicular). Please note that they must be purchased in advance, as they are not sold on board in means of transport. Don't forget to validate them after boarding. There are several fares ranging from 1.20 - 13 EUR, depending on time validity – 30 mins, 90 mins, 24 hours, and 72 hours. Tickets can be bought from yellow ticket machines located at the bus/tram stop or in the underground (visit the website https://pid.cz/en/travelling-around-prague/ for more information).


Taxi from the airport

Prague Airport has Prague airport taxi companies as contractual partners. Their taxi ranks are located next to Terminals 1 and 2. Information on taxi fares for the three companies is available on the information screens by the taxi ranks. The cost is around 500.- CZK (around 20 EUR). Uber, Bolt and Liftago are operating in Prague.



How to get to the venue

The Natura 2000 Biogeographical Seminar for the Continental Region will take place at the Faculty of Environmental Sciences of the Czech University of Life Sciences (Kamýcká 129, 165 00 Prague). The walking distance from the nearest bus station Zemědělská univerzita is approx. 10 minutes.
